Golden Eagle Science Team - Purpose

The purpose of the Golden Eagle Science Team is to ensure conservation efforts on eagles in California and Nevada are based on the best available scientific information. Activities may include assessing data gaps, proposing / developing scientific research, providing scientific review and advice to agencies, and ensuring research methods (e.g., inventory, monitoring) are rigorous.
