General Area: Western Lassen County, private property, Harvey pack area

General situation and animal information: An injured calf was reported on April 9 and investigated the same day by USDA Wildlife Services. After additional wounds were found during veterinary treatment, CDFW returned and re-examined the calf on 10 April.

Physical evidence of wolf predation: No wolf tracks, location data, or sightings around the time of the attack. There was an approx. $3^{"}x 2^{"}$ section of hide and muscle missing from the back of the left hind leg, halfway between hock and tail. It extended approx. $1^{"}$ into the animal. There appeared to be 2 canine punctures within this wound, $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " apart. Several tooth scrapes were found adjacent to this wound and closer to the tail. All were between 1/16 and 1/8" in width. The left hock was swollen.

Evidence of wolf presence near the time of the animal(s) death/injury: None found.

Summary: The size, location, and severity of bite wounds was consistent with coyote predation.



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
